POLICY: TREATY OF WAITANGI

PURPOSE

- To develop a respect for issues raised by the Treaty and an understanding of its place in New Zealand's history
- 2. To encourage students to develop an understanding of Tikanga Maori
- 3. To encourage students to become familiar with and gain an understanding of Maoritanga
- 4. To encourage students to understand and value their bi-cultural heritage
- 5. To help students realise that the contribution made to the life of New Zealand by Maori language and culture is an enriching one

PROCEDURES

- 1. Staff will work towards a Curriculum Plan for Taha Maori
- 2. Opportunities will be provided for all students to learn Tikanga Maori
- 3. Adequate resources will be provided for staff development to support teachers in creating an appropriate Taha Maori programme
- 4. Pastoral care will be provided through culturally appropriate ways
- 5. Maori values and customs will, where practicable, be incorporated into school life
- The Principal will have overall responsibility for the implementation of the Treaty of Waitangi
 policy. (This may necessitate consultation with representatives of the Maori community from time
 to time)
- 7. We will endeavour to expose the children at Stella Maris to Marae Kawa (Protocol)
