POLICY: Behaviour Management

PURPOSE

- 1. To uphold the Christian value 'to love your neighbour as yourself'
- 2. To recognise the rights and dignity of all in their school community by showing respect, honesty, fairness, and caring consideration to others
- 3. To encourage all pupils to develop a greater sense of self-worth, self management and responsibility
- 4. To instil in pupils respect for all property

PROCEDURES

To achieve the above the following will apply.

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POSITIVE RECOGNITION OF POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

All pupils should be recognised for observing rules and recognition needs to be given frequently and immediately. This may include:

- Certificates at assembly
- Positive note to parents
- Mention at assembly
- Early departure from classroom (extra play)
- Visit Principal
- Informal Positive recognition
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GUIDED INTERVENTION

If inappropriate behaviour occurs within the school's area or influence these steps will be taken by staff. Staff will support each other in the steps taken

- Rule broken discussed apology received
- Second offence Time out in specified area/service work during lunchtime/no play zone

When incidents of more serious nature occur, for example:

- Physical abuse of other children
- Swearing
- Speaking inappropriately to adults
- Bullying (refer to anti-bullying policy)
- Unacceptable use of ICT (refer to ICT policy.)

The following actions can be taken :

- Pupil removed from class and school programme to a defined area to work independently for a specified period (under supervision)
- Parent conference. Children must know that this is a most serious step. Contract negotiated
- Repeated offence, contract negotiated and parent contacted again
- Referral to other agencies e.g. RTLB, health nurse
- If bullying is determined refer to anti bullying policy.

PARENT CONFERENCE – Interview Guidelines

When setting up an interview with a parent, teachers need to be clear on these matters:

- Reason for conference
- What do you wish to achieve
- List all inappropriate behaviour to date
- List all child's strengths and abilities
- Agreement reached by parent, teacher and pupil

CLASS CONTROL MEASURES

Teachers have the right to expect good behaviour. Pupils have the right to expect firm, fair and

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consistent treatment from their teacher. Therefore, in class routines will be simple, well-known to the children and insisted on by the teacher

PLAN IN ACTION

- 1) Ensure pupils know and understand the Code of Conduct
- 2) Pupils need to understand the consequences of disregarding the code.
- 3) Positive rewards given frequently and immediately
- 4) Notify parents of code of conduct system in newsletter
- 5) Discuss at parent interviews etc
- 6) Exemplars and sample contracts contained in the organisation folder

With this programme in action the desired outcome is a school environment where each person's personal dignity is respected with love and care
