Dear Parents

This is to advise that a student in St Leo class is currently off school with Chicken Pox (varicella), as it is a very contagious disease, this is to pass on information around Chickenpox . Exposure to the disease can be 14 to 16 days before spots appear, this can be accompanied with a fever. Once spots appear students are infectious for 5 days followed by another 5 days until after the spots / rash have covered over. They are to be excluded from school or other community groups for a full week from the date of the rash appearing.

People with chickenpox have small blisters (like a rash) on their skin. These can be very itchy.

Other symptoms of chickenpox are:

- tiredness
- fever
- general aches and pains.

How long chickenpox lasts

If there are no complications:

- adults generally have the chickenpox infection for 3–7 days
- children are usually ill for about 5–10 days.

Teenagers and adults are more likely to have complications or feel sicker from chickenpox than children.
