Matikao Years 1 - 2: Triadic goal-setting interviews have been a wonderful opportunity to begin the goal setting journey with our young students. It was great to meet with our children's parents and focus on where to next. Thank you to all who gave their time to share thoughts and ideas with us on the ways forward for our children.

Mokehu Years 3 - 4: It has been great to have so many parents this week for goal setting. Mokehu teachers will take time twice a term to review goals with students and adjust them. This week we started our maths cross-grouping. Students have been grouped according to data gathered so far this term, and we are focusing on number knowledge and place value. Students go to their maths groups every day at 11:20am for one hour. They are working with students at a similar level. Next term we will be focusing on addition and subtraction strategies and groups will be adjusted accordingly.

Huruhuru Years 5 - 6: Fridays from 11:20am-12:20pm is a busy time for the team as we are all involved in Discovery Hour. This is an opportunity for us to work with a variety of students and teachers in inquiry learning that is of interest to us. This year we have students doing gaming, research on a variety of topics, coding, creating a band, building and inventing objects, creating things out of plastic and setting up an art gallery. Part of this process involves some of the students sharing their learning at Team Assemblies. This is a great opportunity for us to learn from each other.
