Kia ora e te Whānau

Well the inevitable has happened. We are now registering positive cases within our school community. At time of going to print we have 10 cases across the school. Compared to many other schools in Auckland this is very low numbers. Thank you for letting us know promptly of positive cases and household contacts, enabling us to act quickly. I will continue to inform families if there is a case in your child's class, but it is important that we all monitor closely for symptoms. If your child shows any symptoms please keep them home and get them tested. We continue to have our health measures in place in school and we revise these regularly to ensure we are doing our best to keep everyone as safe as possible. There are a few things you as a family can do to help with this:

Masks: Please ensure your child has a fresh, clean mask everyday, and that it is fitted correctly. Loose masks make it hard for the children to keep them on properly. We have noticed that some of the children are not always wearing their masks correctly, sometimes wearing them below the nose or taking them off inside. Could you please take sometime to talk with your children about how to wear a mask to best protect themselves and those around them. We will continue to reiterate this in class.

Children showing symptoms at school: If your child shows symptoms when at school we will contact you to pick them up. While we realise this can cause an inconvenience it is important that they are picked up as quickly as possible to help keep everyone safe and well.

We would appreciate it if you could please avoid early pickups in the afternoon except in the case of an appointment. This time just before pick up is a very busy time in the office and this week the office staff have spent a lot of time getting children from classes early – sometimes from way down on the other side of the field.

On Tuesday afternoon our teachers joined others across the Auckland Diocese in an online Dedication Mass for Catholic Schools lead by our newly appointed Bishop, Bishop Steve Lowe. In this Mass he spoke of "Christ our Light", how His light rises in our darkness and assures us of His presence among us. This was a reminder to us all that, in the times such as we find ourselves in, we can place our problems into the hands of God by taking a few moments to silently unload our worries and regather our strength. With this in mind I offer the following prayer for those in our community who are sick, and for those who are caring for them.

Christ our Light,
You are the everlasting salvation of those who believe.
Hear us on behalf of those who are sick.
We ask that You restore Your servants to health again.
We ask that you bless the carers with patience and kindness,
May they be Your compassionate presence as they care for their loved ones. We thank You and praise You through Jesus Christ,
our Lord, our light.

School Accounts

These were posted out earlier this week. Thank you to all those who have already set up their AP or paid directly online. The school has changed to a new SMS (Student Management System) which will be rolling out new functions throughout the year giving families greater access to their student's information.

Attendance Dues and Donations for 2022 are \$1198 per child, per year, reduced for families with 3 or more students in the school. A cost of \$299.50 per term. These can be paid online directly, or by automatic payment. If you are setting up an AP please ensure you work out your payments so your

account is cleared by 8th December 2022. You will find the school's bank details on your school statement. There is no longer a 4 digit code for your family, so please refrain from using this from now on. Instead, please can you use your family name and the reference code that relates to the item you are paying, this is found in the fourth column on your statement. It is imperative that this information is included, as we have a number of families with the same surname. For new families to the school, your account can be paid term by term, or many pay in full for the year. 


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
