

POLICY: REPORTING TO PARENTS

Mā te whiritahi ka whakatutuki ai ngā pūmanawa ā tāngata. Together weaving the realisation of potential.

PURPOSE:

- 1. To ensure parents have access to, and an understanding of their child's progress and achievement across the curriculum.
- 2. To assist with developing and promoting links between the school and home.
- 3. To fulfil statutory obligations.

PROCEDURES:

- Reporting to parents will include a parent information evening at the beginning of the school year, triadic goal setting with parents, students and teachers in Term 1, parent-teacher conferences following a mid-year written report, and a written report at the end of the year.
- 2. Reporting will be on the basis of good quality assessment information that draws on a range of evidence to evaluate the progress and achievement of students and build a comprehensive picture of student learning across the curriculum.
- 3. Reporting will include suggestions to help parents and whānau support students' learning.
- 4. Approaches to discuss a child's progress at a time other than those formal times may be made by parents by making an appointment with the student's class teacher.
- All information relating to students is subject to the Privacy Act (2020) provisions. Requests
 for access to student information must be made by a parent, caregiver or guardian.
 REquests must be made in writing and should give the school sufficient notice to collate
 relevant information.
- 6. Refer to Assessment and Evaluation Policy.
