Pope Francis writes,



2. Are you unsure what to do with your old or broken toys that are unfit to re-home?


Thanks to our exciting new partnership with The Warehouse, you can drop them off in-store from now until 26 July. From here, they'll be sent to TerraCycle for recycling.
