DRS Message

In this week's gospel we hear Parables about things that are lost. A coin, a sheep, a son. Jesus explains to us that God grants understanding to those who are seeking Him. It is in God's grace that we are given the ability to hear and understand, to then bear fruit and ultimately join with him in eternity.

This is why I speak to them in parables, because 'they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand.' Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them... But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear." - Matthew 13:11-14, 16

Jesus uses examples of lost things that are valuable, explaining that we too are valuable to God. That God is determined for us to be "found". 
TEAM NEWS
