Teacher Only Day (TOD) - Monday 24th April: This year the Ministry of Education have provided all schools with two teacher only days for professional development in relation to the NZ Curriculum Refresh. The first of these days is to be held in term 2. Stella Maris TOD will be on Monday 24th April, this is in line with the Catholic schools on the North Shore. As Tuesday 25th April is ANZAC Day, term 2 will begin on Wednesday 26th April. We will receive information from the MOE at a later date as to when the second TOD is to be held.

Communication with staff: All discussions about your child and their learning and behaviour should be held in the first instance with your child's classroom teacher. If you need more than a quick catch up with the teacher, it is best to arrange a meeting with them. The time immediately before and after school is usually very busy with lots of students and families around, so this time is best for a quick hello and catch up. Please keep in mind that teachers have meetings after school on Mondays and Wednesdays so will not be available at these times. See the staff list for email details, which are also available on the School App.

Concerns or complaints: If you have any concerns that you wish to raise we ask that you follow the concerns and complaints process.

- 1st Speak with your classroom teacher
- 2nd If the issue continues then speak with the Team Leader
- 3rd The Associate Principal for the team is the next person to speak to if required.
- 4th If the issue is not resolved then contact the principal.
- 5th If the issue continues after this you may lay a formal complaint with the school Board.

Pause, Breathe, Smile: This week you may have heard your child talking about mindful breathing, mindful eating or mindful movement, or maybe red and green zones. This year we are taking part in the Pause, Breathe, Smile programme which is a mindfulness programme that teaches staff and students mindful skills and strategies to improve focus and attention, increase care for self and others, develop emotion regulation skills, and help with making wise choices and boost resilience. The programme is run over 8 weeks, each week building on previously learnt skills. We will provide a bit of information each week in the newsletter so that you are able to share in this learning. We also intend to hold a parent session later in the term. In the meantime check out the notice board in the main atrium for information.
