Kia ora e te Whānau

During this time of Lent, as we prepare for Easter, our classes are discussing the three pillars of Lent – fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Almsgiving is the act of giving to others, with the knowledge that when we give to others we are giving to God. Next week our students and whanau will have the opportunity to give to others as on Friday 17th March, St Patrick's Day, we will have a green mufti day (non-uniform day), and we ask that students bring a can or non-perishable food item such as a packet of rice, pasta or cereal. These donations will be passed on to Love Soup on behalf of the Parish Care and Share team to support people in our community who need extra help in this time. This is also a time for us to show our Marian Values of Compassion, Empathy and Service.

Local History: We are looking to build our school's knowledge of the history of Silverdale and the Hibiscus Coast, in particular the land on which Stella Maris stands, and the pre-European history. Pause, Breathe, Smile: We are a few weeks into the Pause, Breathe, Smile programme at school now and the students have been practising daily mindful breathing, mindful eating and mindful movement, and discussing red and green zones. When we talk of red and green zones we are talking of the different emotions we feel and notice what is happening and how we feel as we experience these emotions. The strategies of mindful breathing, mindful eating and mindful movement are helpful when we find ourselves in the red zone, and can help to bring us back to the green zone. Ask your children to share with you the learning they have done and how they might be able to use this at home as well.

Possible Strike Action: You will have heard in the media that primary teachers and principals have been negotiating our new Collective Agreement. Last week at Paid Union Meetings the latest offer was rejected and over the last few days there has been a ballot regarding possible strike action next Thursday 16th March. The ballot closed last night and we will hear later today if the strike is going ahead – as soon as we know we will let you know either way.

While the negotiations include pay rises, there are also wider concerns raised by principals and teachers about the need to increase support for students with extra needs in their learning, and easier access to this, for increased staffing which would enable smaller class sizes, and increased overall funding for schools to support student learning and achievement.

DRS Message

Each year all Catholic schools undergo an internal review where we report to the Bishop through the Catholic Education Office. Last year we focussed on Evangelisation. The questions that guided us were:

How does the school, through its practices and communications, facilitate encounter with Christ and spread the Good News to the community? What is the effect of this?

Although it is ongoing and will continue to be worked on this year we received tremendous feedback from the Diocese regarding our focus. I thought it would be interesting to share some of this feedback with our community as it identifies some of the ways we as a school worked to combat the challenging times over the last few years.

One section reads:

"The impact of the Covid Protection framework made you realise that 2022 needed to be all about connection - connection with your school community, connection with your Special Character, connection with the parish and through each of these, connection with Jesus. The limits imposed on gatherings meant you had to come up with creative ways to connect for liturgy and prayer. The online Masses with the parish each week that some parents joined online and seeing the parishioners helped to rebuild your sense of community, and kept your children connected with the Mass. In your own school liturgies, each group or class who led a Zoom liturgy took great care to ensure they spread the message of the Gospel clearly and gave everyone an opportunity to participate in different ways. This has also seen a revitalising of your liturgies now that you are able to come together face to face."

The Teachers, Teacher Aides, SLT, Admin staff, Caretakers, Board and all our wonderful relievers demonstrates tremendous commitment to enhancing the Special Character of our school. We are truly blessed to be surrounded by people who even though a pandemic, took opportunities to guide our children in developing their relationships with Jesus.

We thank you Lord for your strengthening Spirit in our school.


