Kia ora e te Whānau

Over the last couple of days I have had the privilege to be the accompanying principal at Marist School in Herne Bay during their Special Character evaluation carried out by the Catholic Education Office. This was a chance for me to gain an understanding of the evaluation process in preparation for our own Special Character evaluation in October. I got to meet and talk with staff, students and parents, and tour the school to see the Special Character and our Catholic faith in action in another school environment. It was lovely to see all that we share, talk about how we do things differently and get some new ideas. Like us here at Stella Maris, they are preparing for Holy Week and Easter and I witnessed learning and

activities about Palm Sunday, The Last Supper and The Stations of the Cross.

I encourage you and your family to join the parish in the Holy Week and Easter services. Holy Week begins this weekend with Palm Sunday and we hear the Passion of the Lord for the first time this season. Holy Thursday is when we hear to story of the last supper and Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. Good Friday is the veneration of the Cross and we hear the Passion of the Lord for a second time, Easter Saturday is the Vigil Mass when we anticipate Jesus' resurrection, and finally the joy of Easter Sunday as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus.



I extend a huge congratulations to the Year 5 and 6 interschool swimming team who won the trophy for small schools for the 5th time in a row. The team returned very excited and shared stories of great individual races and exciting relays. Our tamariki represented our school with pride not only in the way they competed but also in their sportsmanship and support of one another. Ka mau te wehi – fantastic!

Recladding project: At this stage the work on the hall and St Patrick and St Joseph is tracking along on time and when you return in the new term we should have moved back into these spaces and gotten ready for the next stage. The next stage involves the Admin block and St Lucy and St Mary classes. 

Book Character dress-up 11.30am. Children come to school dressed as their favourite book character.





"Ki te ingoa o te Matua, O te Tamaiti O te Wairua Tapu, Amene" In the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit Amen



We begin Holy Week with Jesus' Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem where the streets were lined with supporters of Jesus. At school we journey through the week with Jesus attempting to give our students an insight into this formative week for Our Church. I encourage families to perhaps journey through this week alongside Jesus. Look at the readings together, search for child friendly YouTube cartoons exploring each day. It is through journeying with Jesus that we may come to understand just a little of how much He truly loves us.

Palm Sunday Luke 19:28-40

"Then they led the donkey to Jesus. They put some of their clothes on its back and helped Jesus get on. And as he rode along, the people spread clothes on the road in front of him. When Jesus started down the Mount of Olives, his large crowd of disciples were happy and praised God because of all the miracles they had seen. They shouted, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven and glory to God."

Monday of Holy Week: Jesus clears the temple and is anointed in Bethany with oil. *John 2:13-17*

Jesus is upset to see the House of His Father being used as a "Den of thieves" rather than a "House of prayer". A timely reminder to us that genuine prayer and faith is not always about the outward signs or displays of religion but about our inward relationship with God and how this bears fruit in our lives. Jesus is also anointed by Mary with oil and he recognises this as preparation for His suffering to come.

Tuesday of Holy Week: Jesus returns to Jerusalem and visit the Mount of Olives. John 12:20–38.

Jesus answers attempted traps from religious leaders in the temple and shares a prophesy through parables about Jerusalem's fate while visiting the Mount of Olives.

Wednesday of Holy Week: A day Jesus possibly rested with His Disciples in Bethany. A town where he had performed many miracles including raising Lazarus from the dead.

Maunday Thursday of Holy Week: The Passover and Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemene. John 13:1-38.

Jesus establishes the Lord's Supper. The feast in which we all share. Jesus encourages His Disciples to continually remember His sacrifice. To find strength in His body, given for us and His blood, shed for us. Jesus also despairingly prays in the Garden of Gethsemene. His human fear is offered to God through prayer and He finds strength to face what is to come.

Good Friday: Jesus' crucifixion, death and burial. John 18:28-19:37. The 14 Stations of the Cross occurred on this day. Jesus sacrificed Himself for US. Those with faith can endure the nature of this day as we know the great glory that is to come on Easter Sunday.
