Kia ora e te Whānau

This weekend the church celebrates Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost is the end of the Easter season and is when we celebrate the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples. Before He ascended into Heaven Jesus had told the disciples that He would send them an advocate to be with them forever — this advocate came on Pentecost Sunday in the form of the Holy Spirit. Jesus appeared one last time to the disciples saying "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so am I sending you... Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:19-23). Pentecost is an annual celebration of the birth of the Church and an opportunity to call upon the Holy Spirit as we renew our own commitment to the mission of the Church — to be disciples and spread the Good News. This weekend when you attend Mass don't forget to wear red or orange, the colours of Pentecost. Next Monday at school we will have a red, orange or yellow mufti day as part of our school celebrations for Pentecost.

Charism Award: Twice a term we present a Charism Award to a student in each team who has stood out in the way in which they display the Marian Values and "Shine for God". This week we congratulate Leo Doyle (Matikao Team), Charlie Lambert (Mokehu Team) and Charles Cate (Huruhuru Team) as very deserving recipients of the Charism Award. 

The birthday of our Church is celebrated in style at Stella Maris. On Monday, 29th May, a red and yellow mufti day sees the students, staff and the school brightly shining in flame colours. The main atrium is decked out in celebratory style with balloons, signs and multiple languages on display reminding us of the disciples Spirit given gift of speaking different languages. "He is Risen" is shared

in over 20 languages from Braille to Te Reo. St Patrick class will lead the school in liturgy. A special disco for each team throughout the day adds a special touch to the celebrations with a treat provided by the school giving our students the feeling that this day is special for us as Catholics. Pentecost Celebration Monday 29th May MUFTI DAY




Mix and Mingle Evening – TONIGHT 25th May
