#### **DRS Message**

As we are exposed to more of the painting and re-cladding around the school we notice the colour blue beginning to dominate our walls. This encouraged me to look into why we associate the colour blue so strongly with Our Blessed Mother, Mary. Traditional paintings of Mary using the colour blue can be traced back to the Byzantine Empire, circa 500 AD. Blue at this time was the colour of an Empress. The association of Mary and blue though, can be linked to the Old Testament as well where the Ark of the Covenant was shrouded in a blue cloth to protect it. Mary, having carried our Saviour, Jesus, is seen as the Ark of the New Covenant. She was the dwelling place of God on Earth through her Son, Jesus. In iconography blue is often the colour of Heaven and represents the Divine. In Jewish traditions blue represents the sky and spirituality. Blue in Hindu can be linked to love,  $\omega$ strength and divine joy. Blue in the Islamic faith often represents the impenetrable depths of the universe and is a metaphor for nature. Blue in Buddhism is used to represent the healing Buddha, signifying calm, healing and purity. Blue in Sikhism is the colour of the warrior and of protection. Blue in the Coptic faith represents the Heavens, along with the Egyptian sky and water.

In other areas the color blue represents both the sky and the sea and is associated with open spaces, freedom, intuition, imagination, inspiration, and sensitivity. Blue also represents meanings of depth, trust, loyalty, sincerity, wisdom, confidence, stability, faith, and intelligence. Blue can represent rest and can cause the body to produce chemicals that are calming and release feelings of tranquility. Blue is also cooling in nature and helps with balance and self-expression.

While these things may not have been part of the planning decisions around using blue, we can see the Holy Spirit working strongly. The external colour at Stella Maris represents so very much about our understandings of Mary, her place in our Catholic Church, her meaning to us as Patron Saint of Aotearoa, Our Star of the Sea, and her guidance as one who leads us closer to Jesus.



#### Hockey




