Kia ora e te Whānau

As you are aware, throughout this year we have been reviewing our Local Curriculum, this is how we make the NZ Curriculum specific to Stella Maris and our community. The survey earlier this year and the one you completed for the Catholic Education Office as part of our Special Character Evaluation gave us in insight into what you see as important for our students and whānau. With this in mind, as the staff have unpacked the refreshed NZ Curriculum, Te Mataiaho, we have been learning the story of our school and the local area, and we have reviewed our Mission Statement, Marian Values, Learner Capabilities (Key Competencies) and the Inquiry Framework. Last Friday's Teacher Only Day was used to finalise the resources around each of these aspects, and how we will launch the Local Curriculum fully at the beginning of next year. You'll remember from the end of Term 3 Board newsletter that we shared with you the reviewed Mission Statement and Marian Values, as a reminder these are noted below:

**Mission Statement:** As a Christ centred community, inspired by Mary and our Catholic faith, we will support, challenge and empower each other to strive for personal excellence to navigate life's journey.

Marian Values: At Stella Maris we "Shine for God" through the Marian Values of *faith, love, wisdom, belonging, service and guardianship*. Further on in the newsletter are essence statements for each of the Marian Values.

We will provide more information from the beginning of next year as we unpack all aspects of the Local Curriculum with the students.

# **DRS Message**

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, (the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe). Celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, this feast day was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. While a special feast day needs to be recognised, we see several events throughout the life of Jesus alluding to His Kingship. The biblical Magi visited Mary, Joseph and Jesus and offered gifts symbolising His importance. Prophetic gifts for a future King. Each of these precious gifts has a symbolic meaning. Frankincense was used for worship in the Temple; it is symbolic of Christ the High Priest. Gold is symbolic of Christ the King. Myrrh a perfume, was used to anoint dead bodies, it is symbolic of His death for the sake of truth, and therefore of Christ the Prophet. We know Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey being treated as a King in many ways. People laying down cloaks, waving palms and shouting praise. We hear Pilate ask Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" It is clear that Jesus' response must have made an impact, as he chose to have written above the head of Jesus on the Cross, 'King of the Jews'. The Israelites had expected for so long that the Messiah would be a warrior king, and they wanted Him to save them from the Romans. Jesus did come to save them, and us all, but not from the Romans. This Feast points to Christ's mission, bringing about the fullness of the Kingdom of Heaven and leads us into the anticipation of Advent.
