This Sunday we begin our Advent journey. We reflect during this time on the Love, Peace, Hope and Joy that the coming of our Saviour, Jesus, brings. We begin our Liturgical Strand- Advent in classes.

Year 1 and 2 classes explore many of the traditions of Advent. They explore how Advent is a time for waiting with others, as Mary did with Elizabeth. They also explore how families are preparing for Christmas and how we, the church, prepare for Christmas.

Year 3 and 4 classes look a little deeper into the place of Advent within the Liturgical calendar. They explore the traditions and meanings of the Advent wreath. They learn how John the Baptist prepared some for the Messiah and how we prepare today for the coming of Jesus. They explore the Whakapapa - Family tree of Jesus and the people in His life.

Year 5 and 6 classes explore in greater detail the symbols of Advent. They will also look into how we prepare internally for the celebrations of Christmas. They also explore the people of Advent, along with the people in the Old Testament who prepared the way for the Messiah.

We prepare across the school in many ways, with each class using an Advent wreath during daily prayers. We create a school wide Jesse tree. The Liturgical colour of purple adorns every classes prayer focus. Our Year 1 and 2 team prepare for and present a team Nativity play. We have classes lead liturgies exploring Advent and our end of Year Mass celebrates our Special Character and Charism, along with all we have achieved across the year. It is important to us at Stella Maris to focus in on our purpose. To create opportunities for our tamariki to have personal encounters with Jesus.

Dear Jesus, help us focus on you during this busy season.

May we stay aware of the joy you bring into our lives.

We want to find you in the everyday moments and come with hearts of gratitude to your manger on Christmas.
