DRS Message

Organisation is well underway for two very important liturgies in our school calendar. St Patrick class are rehearsing their liturgy to lead the school in the Stations of the Cross on Thursday 28th March. This is where we will explore the 14 Stations that highlight moments from Jesus being condemned to die on the cross all the way to the placement of His body in the tomb. There is a real sense of prayerful journey when our school prays these Stations. We explore the sacrifice Jesus made for us in a way that is appropriate for children but still recognises what he did for us. It is always a privilege to work with our seniors developing these Liturgies and hearing their reactions and responses to being part of the story telling. One student mentioned to me at the last rehearsal that he found standing so still really challenging but it would have been so much harder for our student who was at that time carrying the cross, and that, he said, wouldn't have been anywhere near the challenge Jesus would have had during that time.

We also have St Dominic class beginning to put together the Resurrection Stations, also known as The Way of Light, for Thursday 4th April. It is a blessing we are able to return to school so quickly after the Easter celebrations so we are able to explore the events after Jesus' Resurrection while all the events of Easter are so fresh in our minds. This Liturgy explores scripturally recorded events from the moment of Jesus' resurrection to the coming of the Holy Spirit. Created in the late 1980's these stations were created to help us focus on the positive and hopeful aspect of our Christian story.

We warmly invite everyone, whanau, friends and parishioners to join us for these special Liturgies that we pray will lead all of us to a closer relationship with Jesus through understanding more closely His sacrifice and love for us all as well as the hope and forgiveness we are offered.




