DRS Message

Today, Thursday 28th March 2024, we reverently prayed the Stations of the Cross as a school. Brilliantly led by St Patrick's class. The Stations of the Cross is a form of prayer used traditionally in Lent. Each of the 14 Stations retells parts of Jesus' Passion (his suffering and death) through images and words. These Stations of the Cross introduce children to Jesus' Passion, breaking it down into stages that they can reflect upon and remember. The Stations are more than the retelling of a story: they are a prayerful participation in the event that lies at the heart of Christianity – Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. It is traditional to recite all Stations in one act of worship. The Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, also known as the Way of Sorrows are a series of images depicting Jesus on the day of His crucifixion and accompanying prayers. At Stella Maris we don't end our Liturgies related to this there. We come together again to pray the Stations of the Resurrection next Thursday, 4th April. These pick up from where our Stations of the Cross finish. Jesus in the Tomb. It is vital we remember that although this Holy Week we journey with Jesus through His suffering, we too can enjoy the Resurrection on Easter Sunday and be filled with the love and guidance of the Holy Spirit to work together to bring about the Kingdom of God here and now.

Heavenly Father, your Son, Jesus, showed his great love for us by making the long, slow journey to his death.

we are promised a place with you in heaven.

Policy: Cellphone and Other Personal Devices

A personal digital device is any privately owned digital device that is not part of any school approved Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programme.

Stella Maris Catholic School does not recommend that students bring personal digital devices to school.

We discuss school rules about digital devices at the beginning of the year, and throughout the year as needed. Any changes to our school rules are communicated to students and to our school community.

Parent/Caregiver Responsibilities

Students should not use smartwatches for communication during school hours. If a parent/caregiver needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the office.

If a student brings a personal digital device to our school, the following guidelines apply:

- The school does not accept responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen personal digital devices brought to the school but investigates any issues as appropriate.
- Students must turn off their device and hand it to the office at the start of the day, and can collect it at the end of the day.
- · Devices may not be used at breaktimes.
- If devices are used for a learning activity, this must be approved and supervised by teaching staff.

An exemption applies to personal digital devices that are required for medical reasons. The principal must be advised of this need, and these will be overseen by staff.

EOTC Statement

- Students are not allowed to take devices to EOTC events.
- Students are expected to follow our Digital Technology and Online Safety policy when using personal digital devices on school property or the school network.

Inappropriate use:

If a student uses a personal digital device inappropriately (including using a cellphone or smartwatch when it is not allowed) the student must hand it to a staff member immediately when asked. If possible, students should lock their device before handing it to staff. The device will be kept in the office and can be collected by the student at the end of the day. Any further offenses will result in the device being held at the office until a parent collects it.

Inappropriate use of a personal digital device may include:

- · Using the device when not permitted
- · Any sort of bullying including online bullying
- · Taking photos or videos of other people without their permission
- Forwarding inappropriate messages or content

Inappropriate use of a personal digital device is managed through the Behaviour Management, Responding to Digital Incidents and Surrender and Retention of Personal Digital Devices policies and procedures, as appropriate.
