### Christ has risen! Alleluia!

Today we thank St Dominic class and Mr Hobman for leading us in the Resurrection Stations. In telling this story they reminded us that Easter did not finish last Sunday with the resurrection of Our Lord. The liturgical season of Easter continues until Pentecost. In the coming weeks we will hear through the gospel of the times Jesus appears to his disciples, and throughout this time we are all reminded that we too, need to continue with His mission to love one another and spread the Good News.

This Sunday, the second Sunday of Easter we will hear of Jesus first appearing to the disciples in a closed room. All were there except for Thomas and he did not believe them when they said, "We have seen the Lord." It was not until the second time Jesus appeared and Thomas was there. This is when He says, "You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe."

On the third Sunday of Easter we will hear the story of the Road to Emmaus. In this Jesus reminds us that all that happened had been predicted and written down. He wants us to know that when things look hopeless or we have doubts we need only look to Scripture to know that first Christ suffered, then He was glorified.

The fourth Sunday of Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday. This is when Jesus identifies himself as the good shepherd, who lays down His life for the sheep. In times of difficulty or sorrow we often take comfort from praying Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

On the fifth Sunday Jesus says, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser." We can take comfort from knowing Jesus is with us always as He goes on to say that "a branch cannot bear fruit by itself, it must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches."

On the sixth Sunday Jesus tells us of the greatest commandment of all, "Love one another, as I have loved you." This reminds us of the generosity and inclusivity of God's outpouring of the Spirit of Love. Let our hearts be formed by love. Let our lives be formed by love.

The seventh Sunday of Easter is The Ascension of The Lord. At this time Jesus tells His disciples, all of us, to "go out into the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation." Then He ascended into heaven, to take His place at the right hand of God, Our Father. This is a time for us to reflect upon how we already do as Jesus told us, and what more we can do.

The last Sunday of Easter is Pentecost Sunday. In the reading from The Acts of the Apostles we hear how the disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit and receive the gift of speech to enable them to fulfil Jesus mission – to go out and spread the Good News.

#### **DRS Message**

Easter lessons for our students focus on the Resurrection of Jesus and the events that occurred after this. Throughout the school we explore the many stories of Jesus interacting with his disciples and how this period of time sets the scene for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Lessons explore many areas and below are a few of the Learning Intentions for the Easter lessons.

- ♦ Recognise Easter Sunday as the day Jesus rose from the dead.
- ♦ Recognise Easter Sunday as the happiest of days for God's people.
- ♦ Recognise the words Jesus spoke to His friends after he rose from the dead.
- ♦ Explore the story of the Road to Emmaus.
- Identify the feelings of those involved in the Easter Stories.
- ♦ Recognise that we have everlasting life because of the Resurrection.
- Explain how Easter helps Christians have hope.
- ♦ Explain the meaning of new life at Easter.
- ♦ Recognise some differences and similarities in the gospel accounts of the first Easter story.
- Explain why the stories that occur after Easter are so important.
- ♦ Identify what the Resurrection of Jesus means for Christians today.
- Identify how Christians show joy in the Easter celebrations.
- Explain the meaning of the Easter Candle.
- ♦ Explain how Christians today meet the risen Jesus in the celebrations of the Eucharist.

Jesus - as we share in the waiting for your birth during Advent, give us patience.

Jesus - as we remember your coming at Christmas, give us joy.


Jesus - as we walk with you on your Lenten journey to the cross, give us strength.


