Winter uniform: When we return to school next term the students make the move to winter uniform. The long sleeved tops are optional. Many children prefer to wear the short sleeved tops throughout the year and this is okay, however it is important that any thermals worn underneath for warmth are not visible. During the Covid period we allowed the option of long trousers as we had to have classes wide open for ventilation. As we are no longer required to have the classes open in the same way through winter we will not be returning to the long trouser option this year. When you are purchasing winter shoes please ensure you buy plain black shoes - no white soles or colour on the shoes. Shoes can be lace up, buckle or velcro, but keep in mind the children should be able to put them on and do them up themselves. We are phasing out the socks with the stripe on them and moving to plain black knee high socks which you do not need to purchase from the uniform shop. One final note - please ensure all uniform items are clearly named, including fleeces, shoes and socks. Named items can easily be returned to students if found around the school. If you purchase second hand uniform items it is helpful to remove the old


Mokehu


