
Attendance: Improving school attendance rates is one of the government's main focus points. It is important that students are at school everyday that school is open, as regular absences impact upon student progress and achievement. Punctuality is also important – it can be embarrassing for a student if they come into class after the day has started, and it can be disruptive for a class that is in prayer or has begun their day's learning. We encourage families to have students at school around 8:30am, giving them time to prepare for the school day before the 8:45am bell. I also remind you that family holidays that are taken during term time are considered an unjustified absence and are marked as such on the attendance register, and will show as unjustified on your child's report. You need to inform the school office if your child is away or going to be late due to appointments. You can do this by ringing the office, emailing absences@stellamaris.school.nz or using the school app.

Pentecost Mufti Day: Next Friday, 17 May, we celebrate Pentecost – the birthday of the Church. Children may come to school in red, orange or yellow mufti (NO gold coin required), there will be a liturgy led by St Augustine and other activities for the students to take part in through the day

Teacher Only Day: Please note that school will be closed on Friday 31 May for a Teacher Only Day. This is the Friday of the King's Birthday long weekend. This is one of two teacher only days the Ministry of Education has allocated for curriculum development this year.

This term's theme in our new Religious Education curriculum is Te Rongopai- Good news. This theme focuses on Sacred Scripture in the Tradition of the Church, as God's relationship with people, with us (Revelation). It addresses such questions as what does the Bible contain, where did it come from and what do the stories mean for me? It highlights the 'joy of the Gospel' and addresses the complexity of revelation and interpretation as appropriate to different ages of young people. It invites and equips young people with ways of reading and praying Sacred Scripture. The aim is that Young people will develop an understanding of the Bible as a library of books with a range of origins, authorship, genre, style and purpose. They will be able to retell many of the narratives and concepts, and will develop an understanding of the significance of these texts, as part of God's revelation, within the Catholic Tradition and for human society today.
