Who are we that you should care for us? The stars have practical uses also, as an aid for navigation and as an indicator of the seasons. Bishop Pompallier, Marist fathers and brothers, the first group of the Sisters of Mercy, early Mill Hill fathers, and many others, learned Te Reo to be able to build relationships with the indigenous population."

Our Faith is enriched through the integration of Te Ao Maori Te Ao Māori context where all the elements of creation within the living and spiritual realms are interrelated.



Dance Class At Stella Maris






