We thank these students for the way in which they model the Marian Values as they serve others, show love and faith, and help others to have a sense of belonging in their class, team and school.

On Tuesday evening it was lovely to meet with many of our new families and formally welcome them to Stella Maris at the Pizza and Chips evening for new families. It was lovely to hear how settled the students, and their families, are into the school community. This evening was a chance for new families to meet one another, to meet school leadership and team leaders and the School Board. We look forward to getting to know you more over the years you are part of the Stella Maris community.

Attendance: You will be aware that one of the Government's initiatives is to improve student attendance at school. They have set a target of 80% of students to be present at school for more than 90% of the term by 2030. 90% of the term would mean that students are absent for less than 5 days each term. I thought you might be interested in our Term 1 attendance data.

At Stella Maris in Term One 74% of students attended school regularly (regular attendance is 90%, or absent for less than 5 days a term). This means that our attendance is below the expected 80%.

The main reasons given for absence in Term one were:

- · Illness/Medical 61%
- Holiday (an unjustified absence) 21%
- · Justified absence (e.g., bereavement) 11%
- · Accepted but unjustified absence (e.g., dance exams) 7%

We appreciate you keeping your children home when they are too unwell to attend school as this helps to keep other students and staff well. We understand the other absences noted above but we do ask that you are mindful of these sorts of absences as repeated absences do impact on student's learning and achievement. You will be able to see your child's attendance rate on their mid year report which will be available to you on Hero at the end of this term.

Save the Date: Thursday 27th June, 7:15am – You are all invited to join us for a Matariki liturgy, followed by a shared breakfast at 8:00am. More information about this will follow.

Reminder: Teacher Only Day – tomorrow, 31st May. School will be closed on this day as the staff will be participating in professional development related to the changing curriculum. Please note that school is also closed on Monday 3rd June for King's Birthday long weekend.

Last Sunday we celebrated the Solemnity of the most Holy Trinity. Our new Religious Education curriculum has combined what used to be separate strands of learning into one Strand we call, Te Atua-God. The learning in this theme focuses on the nature of God as revealed in the scriptures and the Tradition of the Church. It addresses such questions as who, where, what is God and what does God do? It considers each person of the Trinity: God the Father, Jesus and Holy Spirit. It addresses God's relationship with us — individually and collectively, and our relationship with God. We explore how God is one and God is also three. At appropriate levels, our students have the opportunity to explore arguments for the existence of God, and traditional and popular images of God including their own images.

The nature of God as Trinity – three persons in one God — is essential for understanding the Christian faith, and the concept of 'divine mystery' and the inability of human minds to ever fully encapsulate the Divine should be communicated.

Through this Theme we:

- Introduce the concept of the God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) who loves us and is present to us.
- · Explore how God is a Trinity of 3 Persons who overflow with love.
- · Understand that each Person of the Trinity is special and shares gifts with us.




