Today we listened to several inspiring speakers, the first of whom was Joe Paprocki whose keynote presentation was titled 'Transforming Hearts and Minds'. In his keynote Joe reminded us that as parents and teachers we are catechists for our children. He said that faith formation is so much more that simply conveying information – it is about teaching a way of life, the way of Jesus. Catechists are not teachers of a subject, catechists are facilitators of an encounter with Jesus Christ. Our role is to equip those we teach with the ability to see Jesus, to meet Jesus. Listening to Joe was a reflective time in which I thought about the ways that we do this at Stella Maris. It has been a prayerful, reflective day and I look forward to the next two days.

A huge thank you to our PTFA and all who helped make Friday night's Winter Wonderland so much fun for all of the students. It was lovely to see some of our past pupils helping out. There was a lot of laughter, loud singing, and energetic dancing led by DJ extraordinaire, Mr Hobman, who had just as much fun as the children.

The Gospel for Sunday 30th June explores two miracles of Jesus. He heals a woman who has been unwell for years but He deflects ownership of the healing onto her belief. Jesus said to the woman, "Dear woman, you are made well because you believed. Go in peace. You will have no more suffering." He tells her that because she made her way through the crowds to touch His cloak and knew just getting close to Him would help her. Her faith inspired action and the power of God became visible through her actions and faith. How do we push through the crowds to get close to Jesus? When and where do we reach out in faith to touch His cloak.

We also hear how Jesus raises a dead girl to life. He says to her, "Talitha, koum!" (This means, "Little girl, I tell you to stand up!") The Glory and Power of God is revealed in some way through this miracle. Perhaps we can hear this command for ourselves. Jesus is perhaps speaking to all of us in some way through this miracle. How can we "Stand Up?" Is there a way we can be a part of God's Kingdom, a part of the story of God's revelation to others? Is there a way we can respond to this call to action from Jesus?

Lord, you call us to 'be holy', and that is not something we can ask you to do for us by some miraculous act, it demands our attention, the willing involvement of body, mind and soul, when lives are changed by a conscious desire to become the people you have called us to be. Be with us on that journey, that's all we ask, dear Lord.






