## **DRS Message**

What does it mean to "Shine for God" at Stella Maris?

Our school motto is often talked about here at Stella Maris but it is through our actions that we truly explore it. One of the highlights of our whole school sporting year is our Cross Country. The students had been training for months and through our health and RE programmes we explored how our bodies are a gift from God and we are encouraged to look after them and use them as an expression of thanks for this gift. Our Year 1 God strand looks at how each person has their own tapu/sacredness and we are all God's best creations. By using our bodies as best we can during our Cross Country we are honouring God. We are "Shining for God" as we exercise, train and enjoy the mud, grass and sunshine.

Another way our school "Shines for God" during the Cross Country is through the amazing support offered for all students. Our Year Five and Six leaders ran many laps with younger classes to support them during their races. Many running multiple laps at different times throughout the afternoon. The crowd at the top of the bank constantly cheered for the runners. Our House points system added excitement as chants of "Go Nazareth! Go Bethlehem! Go Galilee and Go Jerusalem" were shouted. The support was just as fervent for the winners as it was for those who came last. There were many special moments that demonstrate our values as children who weren't in the top 8 places still raised their hands in triumph as they ran across the finish line knowing they'd used their gifts from God to the best of their abilities.




