Next Thursday, 15th August, is the Feast of the Assumption. This is a very important day for us as Catholics in Aotearoa New Zealand. As well as being our school's feast day, it is the patronal feast day of New Zealand, and is a holy day of obligation.

The history of this feast day for us in Aotearoa New Zealand goes back to 1838 when Bishop Pompallier celebrated the first Mass in New Zealand and dedicated our country to Mary as "Our Lady Assumed into Heaven", placing our country under the protection of Mary as she is now – alive, body and soul, rejoicing in the happiness of God's kingdom.

In 2021 the Bishops of Aotearoa New Zealand renewed Bishop Pompallier's dedication of our country to Our Lady Assumed into Heaven. They commissioned an artwork by Damien Walker called Ko Hāta Maria, te Matua Wahine o te Atua Holy Mary, Mother of God. This beautiful icon connects Mary to our country, links the French heritage of Bishop Pompallier and tells a story of our faith and beliefs as Catholics. The icon is now on display at St Mary of the Angels in Wellington and it is beautiful to see in person. If you are in Wellington I highly recommend going to see it.

This week at our Teacher meeting we set time exploring our wonderful resources for prayers and explored the many different ways we encourage our students to encounter Jesus through prayer. We explore many different forms of prayer. Traditional and devotional prayer. Karakia and meditation. Imaginative prayer. Praying in creation. Praying using our creativity. Praying using journaling. Praying through song and music. Prayers of the mass and many more engaging ways of praying.

The Achievement Aims for our curriculum in this area:

In the study of Prayer and praying, the children will gain and apply knowledge, skills, attitudes and values to assist them to:

1. Develop a rich resource of traditional prayers, various prayer forms and ways of praying.

2. Grow in deep and lasting relationship with God who is trinity, the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit.

3. Grow to understand that God is at the centre of their lives and that this gives meaning to the whole of life.

- 4. Become more deeply aware of the person God created them to be.
- 5. Develop the ability to pray and to adore God with their whole being.
- 6. Develop a reflective, conscious, creative stance towards life.

7. Ground their spirituality in their own cultural heritage while being aware of other spiritualities especially that of Tangata Whenua.

There are many resources online that whanau can use at home and we encourage you to talk to your children about what they do for prayers at school, what they enjoy about it and to perhaps lead moments of prayer at home.




