Kia ora e te Whānau

Thank you to all of the dads who attended school last Friday afternoon for Dads' Day. Seeing the absolute joy on the children's faces as they greeted you was a firm reminder of why days like this are so important. The buzz around the school was amazing and it was fabulous to see everyone so engaged and enjoying sharing in the learning and play at school. Thank you so much for coming along and making the day so special.

The PTFA fundraising helps with the projects that fall outside of the operation funding of the school. Some of the projects that PTFA have helped us to complete for our students since the school opened in 2005 include the building of the playgrounds, iPads in all classes, improved drainage in the school field, the bike track, the sun shades over the playgrounds and a number of smaller projects as well.

Our major focus for fundraising this year is an upgrade of the junior playground, including changing the bark to a safety matting. Our playgrounds are now reaching the age (20 years) where some equipment needs to be replaced or upgraded to ensure the safety of our students. This project is going to cost over \$100 000, therefore every little bit that we raise through fundraising events such as the Wheel-a-thon, Quiz Night, discos, Splash and Dash helps greatly.

We have two major fundraising events coming up before the end of the term. The Quiz Night for parents on Friday 20th September, and the Wheel-a-thon for the students on Wednesday 25th September. Most of the tables for the Quiz Night are sold, and after only 3 days of registering we have 86 students our of 331 signed up for the Wheel-a-thon fundraising. Please check the Wheel-a-thon notice that came home earlier this week for more information about this event and how to sign the children up for the fundraising aspect.

Many of you may be aware that the empty piece of land across from Stella Maris (at the roundabout on Millwater Parkway) is currently owned by the Auckland Catholic Diocese. When Stella Maris opened in 2005 the plan was to build a Catholic secondary school on the land a few years later, however for a number of reasons this did not happen. For a secondary school to be viable you need at least 100 students at each year level – Stella Maris is too small for this. After much deliberation Bishop Steve Lowe and the team at the Diocese have made the difficult decision to sell the land. The large billboards that have appeared on the land this week will shortly have advertising on them related to the sale of the land. The Diocese continues to support Stella Maris, and our students continue to have a pathway for continuing Catholic schooling at Carmel College and Rosmini College.

This week we have kept in our prayers two important people who have passed away, The Māori King, Kiingi Tuheitia and Bishop Denis Browne (past Bishop of Auckland and then Hamilton). We remember each of these well respected men who showed strong leadership in their respective roles. *Eternal rest grant unto them o Lord, may they rest in peace.*

Basketball


