#### **DRS Message**

Term 4 Strats off in October, the month we dedicate to praying the Rosary here at Stella Maris. The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th. The Rosary is, at heart, a Christo-centric prayer with all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety. As Pope St John Paul II said: "To recite the Rosary is nothing other than to contemplate with Mary the face of Christ."

Each class prays a Decade of the Rosary every day in class and we come together on Thursdays during October for a whole school rosary.

Huruhuru will lead our Whole school Rosary on 17th October at 9am.

Mokehu will lead our Whole school Rosary on 24th October at 9am.

Matikao will lead our Whole school on 31st October at 9am.

We aim to teach our students that the Rosary, in Catholic tradition, is said to have been instituted by the Blessed Virgin in the 13th century. Mary is said to have appeared to St Dominic and encouraged us to pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be karakia regularly. This was easier for lay Christians to show devotion through these karakia as reading psalms was often not possible. Praying the Rosary encourages us to meditate upon events surrounding the life of Jesus. We encourage our children to bring their sorrows, joys and wonderings to mind as we explore the many moments within the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries. This exploration of traditional prayer helps our students to learn habits, skills and attitudes related to different forms of karakia. We also want them to know that this taonga of traditional prayer has been used for centuries by people to spend time with God and has been passed down to us to continue to help us grow ever closer to a full relationship with God.

Prayer is turning the heart toward God. When a person prays, they enter into a living relationship with God. (*Catholic Faith and Catechism for Youth #469*).

We pray that by reflecting on the Mysteries of the Rosary we might encounter Christ in new ways.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary,
our Lady of the Rosary,
continue to inspire us
to a life of discipleship.


