Kia ora e te Whānau

Yesterday we began our Lenten journey when we joined the parish for Ash Wednesday Mass. In the readings we heard the message that during Lent we are all called to do three things – *to pray, to fast and to give alms*. In his homily Fr Chris talked particularly about fasting, and for us to think about what we choose to give up in this time. It needs to be something that is challenging and gives us pause to reflect, however not so challenging that it makes us grumpy and then impact others negatively. Almsgiving is about donating money, time, services or resources to those in need. Through the parish there are several ways for parishioners to give to those in need: you can donate non-perishable food items that are passed on to Love Soup, you can make a donation to Serving Spoons (details are in the parish newsletter) or you can give to the Caritas Lenten Appeal - envelopes for this can be collected from the church or you can donate online https://www.caritas.org.nz/

Maybe this weekend you could discuss as a family how you could find some time to pray a little more during Lent, what you could choose to give up for fasting, and how you could give alms to help those you know who are in need.



We know that yesterday morning the traffic made getting to school on time difficult, and we really appreciate that families kept in touch and that you all managed to get to school in time that we were able to hop on the buses and arrive at Mass on time.

Goal setting conferences, Wednesday 19 March 1:15pm – 7pm, and Thursday 20 March 3:15pm – 5:45pm. Class teachers will be available for the conferences from 1:15pm in their classrooms, and Senior Leadership and teacher aides will be providing supervision for students from the end of lunchtime until 2:45pm. The Mārama (Year 0-3) students will gather in the library for the afternoon, and the Ahi (Year 4-6) students will gather in the hall for the afternoon. If you wish to pick your child up early you will need to sign them out at the school office as usual. If you have a conference booked between 1:15 and 2:45pm you can pick your child up from either the library or the hall to join you. End of school pick up will run as usual at 2:45pm and the buses will run at the usual time.
