Kia ora e te Whānau

Welcome to the new school year. It has been great to see the students settling into their new classrooms so well, ready for new learning. I extend a very warm welcome to all of the new families who have joined Stella Maris this year, we look forward to getting to know you as the year unfolds. We also welcome two new staff members. Karen Bessone has joined our teaching staff, in St Patrick class (year 5/6) and she too has settled very well into the school community. Kevin Kemble is our new part time caretaker (Thursdays and Fridays) and has been doing a fabulous job of helping to get the school ready for the return to school.

This year, like all primary schools in Aotearoa New Zealand, we are implementing the new English and Mathematics curricula and you will begin noticing some changes in the teaching and learning programmes. Next week all of our Mārama teachers (Year 1-3) will be participating in a 3 day Liz Kane 'Little Learners Love Literacy' workshop from Wednesday to Friday, with a specific focus on the structured literacy programme. The Year 4-6 classes are already teaching Liz Kane 'The Code' structured literacy programme, and in term 2 they will undertake more professional development to further enhance this programme.

In mathematics we are using the 'Maths – No Problem' programme. We received our textbooks and workbooks just as the year started, and in the week before school opened the teachers took part in professional development for the 'Maths – No Problem' programme. You will begin to see teachers and students using this resource from next week.

As the teachers take part in the professional development, and the structured Literacy and Maths programmes are fully implemented we will communicate with you ways that you can support your child's learning at home. In the meantime keep reading to and with your children, sharing the enjoyment of reading, and practice the basic facts in maths.

**Attendance:** You will be aware that raising student attendance at school is one of the education priorities. We appreciate that you keep your child home when they are unwell, this is important to avoid the spread of the bugs. As the year begins we ask that when booking family holidays you book these during the school holidays. Family holidays during term time are an unjustified absence and are marked as such on the attendance register. One of the most positive impacts on student learning and achievement is high and consistent attendance.

**Staff Carpark:** Please note that the carpark between the top gate (Old Mill Rd entry) and the round-about is designated for staff parking. We ask that parents do not park in this area, allowing room for our staff to park.

**End of day pick up:** Parents and caregivers are welcome to pick children up from the classrooms at the end of the day, however we ask that you wait in the main atrium until the 2:35pm bus bell. Waiting outside the classrooms any earlier causes a distraction for the children. We thank you for your support of this.

Meet the Teacher: Parents and caregivers are invited to 'Meet the Teacher' on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February. There will be two sessions: The Mārama Team (Yr 1-3) 3:30pm-4:15pm, and The Ahi Team (Yr 4-6) 4:15pm – 5:00pm. Each of the sessions will begin in the hall as a whole team, and then you will be invited to the classrooms to meet your child's teacher and learn about the specific routines of the class. Please note that this is not a time for one on one discussions with the class teacher, you will have an opportunity for this at the Goal Setting sessions on 19-20 March, or you may organise a separate meeting with the class teacher.

Communication with class teachers: You are welcome to pop into the classroom before or after school for quick catch ups with the class teachers. If you wish to discuss something in more depth it is best to organise a meeting with your class teacher. You can do this by emailing them (see contacts below) or by asking the teacher when you see them before or after school. Please note that we have teacher meetings after school Mondays and Wednesdays so teachers will not be available at these times.

If you have a message that you need to get to your child during the school day it is best to contact the office staff to pass the message on. If you email the class teacher during the school day they are not likely see the message until after school.

We are excited to share this new school year with our students and their whanau, and look forward to working with you throughout the year.


