### **EMERGENCY LOCKDOWN PRACTICE – MONDAY 24<sup>TH</sup> MARCH**

As part of keeping our school safe we need to be able to respond safely and quickly to a range of emergency situations. To help ensure that everyone knows what to do in an emergency situation we hold regular drills and practices here at school.

As part of maintaining our emergency procedures in our school, we are holding a Lockdown **PRACTICE** on Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> March.

We work alongside an independent company, Harrison Tew<sup>®</sup>, who specialises in emergency management planning for schools, whose procedures have been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

On Monday morning specialised training is being conducted with our senior leadership and staff by Harrison Tew<sup>®</sup>. The students will also receive information on how to respond in an emergency directed at their respective age groups from either their teacher or Harrison Tew<sup>®</sup>.

We will then be conducting a lockdown practice under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew®.

During the exercise you will receive a notification from the school via the School App, so please make sure you have downloaded the App and have notifications turned on. The notification will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website. I ask that you **do not** attend the school or phone when you receive the notification as we will not be able to respond during this time.

As we prepare for this exercise, now is a good time to ensure that your contact details and emergency contact details are up to date and correct, so that we have the necessary information should it be required in an emergency.

In a genuine incident, should you become aware of a lockdown or evacuation at the school, I ask that you do not attend the school or phone, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence or contact may make it more difficult for us or the emergency services to manage a situation.

### **DRS Message**

Our theme in RE this term is Te Atua-God. Over the last few years we have been exploring our new RE curriculum and have created Hero goals within each theme of the curriculum. This week at Stella Maris we have been meeting with parents and whanau setting goals for the year in each curriculum area. The RE goals have been based on the Achievement Objectives within each theme and we have designed these to make them specific for us at Stella Maris. You will see that they become progressively more complex over the years.

### Year 1

I can talk about how God loves me.

I can talk to God and Jesus.

### Year 2

I can name the parts of the Trinity.

Talk about how Jesus is my friend and is with me throughout my life.

### Year 3

I can identify the fruits of the Holy Spirit in the words and actions of others and myself.

I can identify moments in our lives where God is present.

### Year 4

I can use an symbol to help explain how the Holy Trinity is 3 in 1.

I can recall the story of Pentecost.

### Year 5

I can give examples of how Jesus teaches me to be a disciple.

I can explain how the Saints in heaven teach me to answer God's call.

### Year 6

I can demonstrate what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

I can investigate people who stood up for justice and truth because of their Faith.

At Stella Maris RE is our first and most important curriculum and these goals are a small snapshot over one term of our learning within the RE curriculum each year. RE books and learning should come home near the end of the term with a Self Assessment task. This will be a great indicator of your child's learning and offer a tremendous starting point for conversations about your child's learning in RE.

### **MĀRAMA TEAM NEWS**


Kia ora Whanau.

### **Sacramental Programme 2025**


