Kia ora e te Whānau

Last week our a Mārama teachers (Yr 0-3) attended the three day structured literacy workshop based upon the Little Learners Love Literacy programme. It was a very intense few days, filled with a lot of learning, and our teachers are bursting to get the programme underway. There will be ongoing fortnightly professional learning after school for the next few months. Over the next week the teachers will be carrying out the baseline assessments before they begin teaching the Little Learners programme. They will then be planning and organising resources to get this programme fully implemented in the coming weeks. Over time you will notice changes, particularly in the way you will support your Year 0-3 children at home. In the meantime – read with your children – have fun reading and sharing books that you have at home, visit the public library and choose books to read together. This helps to develop a love of reading.

"Maths, No Problem" is the maths programme we are using at Stella Maris to meet the requirements of the new Mathematics curriculum. Our teachers have participated in professional learning based upon the new "Maths, No Problem" programme and have begun implementing this programme in classes. They have been excited to see the level of engagement in the students.

Once we have both the structured literacy and "Maths, No Problem" programmes up and running fully, we will hold some parent information sessions to help you understand the changes in literacy and maths, and how you can help at home.

End of day pick up – There have been a number of parents or grandparents arriving in the classroom atriums from 2pm and this creates quite a distraction for the children in their learning, and also removes the ability to use the atrium as a learning space. You are very welcome to pick your child up from the classroom at the end of the day, however we ask that you wait in the main atrium until the bus bell at 2:35pm. Thank you for your support in this.

Meet the Teacher, tomorrow afternoon - There will be two sessions: The Mārama Team (Yr 1-3) 3:30pm-4:15pm, and The Ahi Team (Yr 4-6) 4:15pm - 5:00pm. Each of the sessions will begin in the hall as a whole team, and then you will be invited to the classrooms to meet your child's teacher and learn about the specific routines of the class. Please note that this is not a time for one on one discussions with the class teacher, you will have an opportunity for this at the Goal Setting sessions on 19-20th March, or you may organise a separate meeting with the class teacher.

Ash Wednesday - we are looking forward to joining the parish for Mass next Wednesday for Ash Wednesday, to prepare us for our Lenten journey. You are welcome to join us and the parish for Mass, 9:30am at St John's Orewa.

- Follows a scape and sequence, simple to complex, builds on prior learning
- Simple, direct, reduces cognitive load
- Monitoring, responsive, aiming for mastery
