Thank you to all of the families who came along to the goal setting sessions with the class teachers last week. These goals will help to support your child/ren as they continue their learning for this school year. It is important that school and home work together to support the children in their learning and this is one way we can do this.

School Board Update: There have been a few changes on the School Board since the start of the school year. Richard Bayly's resignation took affect at the beginning of the year, and we welcomed Sheree Buchanan (parent representative) and Fr Chris Denham (Proprietor's appointee) to the Board. Trish Hammond has stepped down as the Presiding Member (Chair), but remains on the Board. Carl Mainwaring has been elected by the Board as the Presiding Member. We thank Trish for all she has done for the school and Board in her time as Presiding Member, and look forward to her continued contribution to the Board as a Proprietor's Rep.

PTFA: The next PTFA meeting is next Wednesday 2nd April, 7pm in the staffroom. At this meeting we will be setting the schedule for fundraising activities for the year. If you would like to be involved in the PTFA you are very welcome to come along and join in the meeting. The goal for the PTFA this year is to raise the remaining funds required for the upgrade of the junior playground, including replacing the bark with a safety matting. As a school we have so far raised about half of the funds required for this project.

Uniform reminders – Term 2 sees the change to the winter uniform. A reminder that when you are purchasing winter shoes for the children they must be plain black school shoes – lace ups, buckles, or Velcro. NO coloured soles on shoes. Children may continue to wear the short sleeved tops through winter, but if wearing something underneath for warmth, it must not be visible.

Other uniform reminders: no make up to be worn to school, earrings are to be a small plain stud (no sleepers), hair is to tied up and off the face with plain black hair accessories.

One of the three pillars of lent is Prayer. Prayer helps us deepen our relationship with God, seek forgiveness and prepare for the celebration of Easter. It can be a perfect time for us to work on a spiritual renewal. Some ideas for strengthening our prayer life during Lent are...

- Praying with the Bible: Personalise scripture by putting your name in it.


Please come and join us as we journey with Jesus to the Cross in a moving Liturgy led by one of our Year 5 and 6 classes.




