Book fair: Next week we are holding our annual Book Fair. This event is a fundraising event for our school library. There are book sales in the library before and after school, and at lunchtime each day next week. You are welcome to make purchases at any of these times. The week will culminate with the Book Character Parade on Friday, 9 May at 11:30am – you are welcome to attend this. Weather permitting the parade will be held outside, otherwise it will be held in the hall.

DRS Message

We celebrated the resurrection of Jesus during the school holidays but as we return to school we are blessed to be able to explore Easter lessons with our classes. Easter lessons focus on the Resurrection of Jesus and the events that occurred after this. Throughout the school we explore the many stories of Jesus interacting with his disciples and how this period of time sets the scene for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Below are a few of the Learning Intentions across all levels of the school for Easter.

- Recognise Easter Sunday as the day Jesus rose from the dead.
- ♦ Recognise Easter Sunday as the happiest of days for God's people.
- Recognise the words Jesus spoke to His friends after he rose from the dead.
- Explore the story of the Road to Emmaus.
- Identify the feelings of those involved in the Easter Stories.
- ♦ Recognise that we have everlasting life because of the Resurrection.
- ♦ Explain how Easter helps Christians have hope.
- ◆ Explain the meaning of new life at Easter.
- ◆ Recognise some differences and similarities in the gospel accounts of the first Easter story.
- ♦ Explain why the stories that occur after Easter are so important.
- ♦ Identify what the Resurrection of Jesus means for Christians today.
- ♦ Identify how Christians show joy in the Easter celebrations.
- ◆ Explain the meaning of the Easter Candle.
- ◆ Explain how Christians today meet the risen Jesus in the celebrations of the Eucharist.

The Teacher prayer from the Liturgical Year resources is below.

Jesus - as we share in the waiting for your birth during Advent, give us patience.

Jesus - as we remember your coming at Christmas, give us joy. Jesus - as we walk with you on your Lenten journey

to the cross, give us strength.

Jesus - as we die and rise with you to a new life, give us energy.

Jesus - as we recall your Spirit coming at Pentecost, give us peace.

Jesus - as we remember all your holy people, make our lives holy so that

we can lead others to know, love and serve you.


Resurrection Stations Liturgy
