On the 20<sup>th</sup> June Aotearoa New Zealand will celebrate Matariki, the Māori New Year. Matariki is star cluster that reappears in our skies around this time each year. The reappearance of Matariki in our skies brings the past year to a close and marks the beginning of the new year.

The star cluster is well known throughout the world and can be seen around the globe at different times of the year. Matariki goes by different names around the world, in English it is called by its ancient Greek name, Pleiades or the Seven Sisters, in Japan it is Subaru (the logo of the Subaru car represents the star cluster), in Hawaii it is Makali'i.

In Aotearoa New Zealand Mātauranga Māori (ancestral knowledge and wisdom) is at the heart of celebrations. It is a time to honour those we have lost in the past year, to give thanks for all that we have and to look forward to the promise of a new year. It is a time to plan and write down our wishes for the new year. Matariki is about connecting with your home and whānau.

At Stella Maris, in the week leading up to the Matariki long weekend, we will be celebrating in a variety of ways. In class the students will learn about Matariki, and in the afternoons they will be in mixed year level groups taking part in music and art activities and telling stories related to learning about Mātaurnaga Māori and Matariki.

The week will culminate in a liturgy and shared breakfast to which you are all invited.

We invite you to join us for Matariki Liturgy and Breakfast Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> June Liturgy will begin at <u>7:30am</u> Followed by breakfast at 8:00am



Breakfast will be cereal, fruit and yoghurt. As Matariki is a time of sharing, and to help with catering we are asking for families to donate the following food items:

Throughout this week we have been preparing to celebrate the Liturgical feast of Pentecost. We aim to explore how this is the time we celebrate the 'Birthday" of our church. Lessons throughout the school will explore these learning intentions;

- Recall the Pentecost story.
- Identify who was present when the Holy Spirit came.
- Recognise how the Holy Spirit came like wind and fire.
- Identify how the actions of wind and fire are like the Holy Spirit.
- Identify some of the things that happen when a person or group is born.
- Relate some of these things to the birth of the Church.
- Recall the people present at the first Pentecost.
- Recognise that Mary was in the upper room praying with the apostles when the Holy Spirit, Te Wairua Tapu came.
- Identify the founding members of the Church.
- Recognise the effects of the Spirit in the lives of the foundation members of the Church.
- Recall the story of the first Pentecost in the life of the Church.
- Recognise ways the Holy Spirit, Te Wairua Tapu, gives life to the Church today.

We start our celebrations at school on Friday with a prayerful Liturgy led by St Lucy exploring aspects of Pentecost. Red, Yellow and orange mufti is worn by all as a symbol that we are all guided by the Holy Spirit. We certainly hope that the joy and excitement of this special day at our school, the Disco, dancing and music, the excitement of mufti and the extra Pentecost learning opens our hearts to the Holy Spirit and strengthens us for the remainder of the Churches year.

#### Pentecost Celebrations Tomorrow - Wear Red, Orange Or Yellow And Bring A Can.


