

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. It i is a liturgical celebration in the Roman Catholic Church that honors the doctrine of the Trinity, which is the belief that God exists as one being in three co-equal persons: Father, Son (Jesus Christ), and Holy Spirit. We explore this when we focus on the Theme, Te Atua-God that considers each person of the Trinity: God the Father, Jesus and Holy Spirit. It addresses God's relationship with us — individually and collectively, and our relationship with God. God is understood in the Catholic faith to be a unity of three 'persons' – the Trinity. The three 'persons', as expressed in the Sign of the Cross, are God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit. These three form a dynamic relationship of overflowing creative and sacrificial love. The purpose of human beings is to live in this loving relationship with God and live out this love in their human relationships.
