### STELLA MARIS SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS 2025

The boards of all state and state integrated schools are required to hold elections every three years, and this will be happening again in 2025.

The School Board is an important part of our school as they set the strategic direction for our school, consult with our school community about our school, ensure the schools funding is spent wisely and ensure that we are giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi within our school.

As a state integrated school, at Stella Maris the School Board if made up of 5 parent elected representatives, 4 Proprietor's Appointees (appointed by the Catholic Diocese), the principal and a staff elected representative. The purpose of the upcoming election is for our school community to nominate and elect the parent elected representatives.

The current board have made the decision to appoint Election Pilot as the Returning Officer for our election and for the election to be provided online. They have been assisting schools with elections for over 20 years and have been the only election provider accredited by the Ministry of Education to provide online election services since online elections started in 2022. Nomination and voting forms will be sent to all eligible voters by email directly from Election Pilot. If we don't have an email address for you, nomination and voting papers will be sent by post so no one will miss out.

School Board Elections must be held in accordance with the provisions in the Education and Training Act 2020 and the Education (Board Elections) Regulations 2022. Your name and contact details have been provided to Schooled Election Pilot to enable the provision of elections services for our school as required by legislation. They will use your contact details for the provision of election services for Stella Maris Primary School only, and your details will be deleted 60 days after the election date as required by legislation.

We will continue to keep you updated through the various stages of the election process, and our election date is 10 September 2025.

### **DRS Message**

This term our Year 1-4 students are exploring the A Tatou-Whakapapa- Our Story theme and our Year 5-6 classes are exploring the Te Rongopai- Good News theme.

A Tatou Whakapapa focuses on the Church's story so far, but also on the young people's own story, the story of their school, people and land. It addresses such questions as where did the Church come from, what are the stories of the Church, and where do these stories intersect with my own life? It considers the Church's story as a shared story that has influenced the whole world and our own land from the perspective of 'this is my own story and our story', rather than just 'their story'.

Te Rongopai focuses on Sacred Scripture in the Tradition of the Church, as God's relationship with people, with us (Revelation 33). It addresses such questions as what does the Bible contain, where did it come from and what do the stories mean for me? It highlights the 'joy of the Gospel' and addresses the complexity of revelation and interpretation as appropriate to different ages of young people. It invites and equips young people with ways of reading and praying Sacred Scripture.

We have class masses for Ahi team this term who also continue their Professional Development in our new RE curriculum. We also look forward to sharing our School Feast day with our Parish community on Friday 15th August at St John's in Orewa.

A busy term in Religious Education at Stella in what is our first and most important curriculum.

Almighty and everlasting God, who assumed the Immaculate Virgin Mary, the Mother of your Son, body and soul into heavenly glory, grant, we pray, that, always attentive to the things that are above, we may merit to be sharers of her glory.


### **Ahi Team**
