Tomorrow, 15 August, we join the parish to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption. On this day as Catholics we commemorate the belief that at the end of her earthly life Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. We reflect on the life of our Blessed Mother, and we honour her role in the Church and her closeness to God. At Stella Maris we reflect upon the virtues she modelled - her unwavering faith, hope, charity (love and compassion) and how we aim to follow her ways through our Marian Values to grow closer to Jesus.

#### Pope Francis wrote:

"... she lived the Beatitudes of Jesus as none other. She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us. (Gaudete et Exsultate, #176)
