Kia ora e te Whānau

This year in the Church is a jubilee year in which the theme is Pilgrims of Hope. On Monday of this week the senior leadership team and myself, alongside leaders from Catholic schools across Auckland, had the privilege of attending a day with David Wells, a theologicial speaker, teacher and family man who took us all on a journey in which we explored what Hope means to us as Catholics, as followers of Christ Jesus. He spoke of the theological virtues – Faith, Hope and Love (Charity). Faith believes – it is what propels us, Love responds and cares – through our love for God and love for our neighbour, and Hope sustains – it brings us home to God our father. He went on to say that Hope will turn apprehensiveness into confident trust, anxiety into serenity and hesitation or doubt into conviction. We are an Easter people, we live with the hope and joy of Jesus's resurrection, and the belief that death, suffering, and despair can be overcome by new life, love, and God's grace. Easter gives us hope – a hope that promises fullness of life.

Extract from the Jubilee Prayer written by Pope Francis:

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, the yearning for heavenly treasures and pour over all the earth the joy and peace of our Redeemer. To you God blessed in eternity, be praise and glory for ever and ever. Amen

DRS Message

This week in the Gospel we hear that God loves us so much that He sent His only Son, that whoever believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life.

God's Love:

The phrase "For God so loved the world" signifies God's universal and unconditional love for all people, regardless of their background or actions.

God's Sacrifice:

To demonstrate this love, God gave His "one and only Son". This is interpreted as God sending Jesus to earth to live a sinless life and die as a sacrifice for humanity's sins.

The Gift of Jesus:

Jesus is presented as the one who offers salvation through His sacrifice.

Belief and Eternal Life:

The condition for receiving this salvation is belief in Jesus. Those who believe will not "perish" (which can mean to die spiritual death), but will receive "eternal life".

Universal Invitation:

God's love extends to the "world," meaning every person. The choice is presented to believe in Jesus as the Messiah and accept His offer of eternal life.
